1. To be – Ser ou estar

Used to describe who or what someone is, or how they feel.

Ex: I am happy. / She is a doctor.

2. To have – Ter

Used to show possession or something someone owns.

Ex: I have a car. / She has two brothers.

3. To do – Fazer

Used to talk about actions or work.

Ex: I **do** my homework every day.

4. To go – Ir

To move from one place to another.

Ex: They **go** to school at 8 AM.

5. To get – Obter, conseguir, pegar

To receive, obtain, or become something.

Ex: He **got** a new job. / I **get** tired after work.

6. To say – Dizer, falar

Ex: She said hello to me.

7. To make – Fazer, criar, produzir

To build, create, or produce something.

Ex: I made a cake yesterday.

8. To take – Pegar, levar

To move something from one place to another, or to grab something.

Ex: **Take** this book with you. / He **took** my pen.

9. To see – Ver

To use your eyes to look at something.

Ex: I **see** a bird in the tree.

10. To come – Vir

To move toward the person speaking or toward a place.

Ex: Can you **come** here, please?

11. To look - Olhar

To turn your eyes in a direction to see something.

Ex: Look at the sky! It's so blue.

12. To like – Gostar

To enjoy or feel good about something.

Ex: I **like** pizza. / She **likes** to swim.

13. To want – Querer

To wish for something or feel a need for it.

Ex: I want a new phone.

14. To need – Precisar

To have to have something because it's important or necessary.

Ex: I **need** water. / You **need** to study.

15. To eat - Comer

To put food in your mouth and chew it.

Ex: We eat breakfast at 7 AM.

16. To drink - Beber

To put a liquid in your mouth and swallow it.

Ex: He **drinks** water after running.

17. To use - Usar

To do something with an object for a purpose.

Ex: I **use** my phone every day.

18. To put – Colocar, pôr

To place something somewhere.

Ex: **Put** your bag on the table.

19. To play – Brincar, jogar, tocar (instrumento)

To do something fun like games, sports, or music.

Ex: The kids **play** outside. / She **plays** the guitar.

20. To work - Trabalhar

To do a job or activity to earn money or to get something done.

Ex: They work in an office.

21. To walk - Andar, caminhar

To move on your feet at a normal speed.

Ex: I walk to school every day.

22. To run – Correr

To move quickly on your feet.

Ex: She **runs** in the morning.

23. To read - Ler

To look at words and understand them.

Ex: He **reads** a book every night

24. To write – Escrever

To put words on paper or a screen.

Ex: I write emails at work.

25. To talk – Conversar, falar

To speak with someone.

Ex: They **talk** on the phone every evening.

26. To help – Ajudar

To do something for someone to make things easier.

Ex: Can you **help** me with this?

27. To wait – Esperar

To stay in a place until something happens.

Ex: We wait for the bus every day.

28. To buy - Comprar

To pay money to get something.

Ex: I **buy** coffee every morning.

29. To live – Morar, viver

Ć To have your home in a place ∕ to be alive.

Ex: They **live** in New York.

30. To watch – Assistir, observar atentamente

To look at something for a period of time (TV, movie, etc.).

Ex: We watch movies on weekends.

31. To leave – Sair, partir, deixar

To go away from a place or person.

Ex: I **leave** work at 6 p.m.

32. To listen – Ouvir com atenção, escutar

To pay attention to sound or someone speaking.

Ex: Listen to the teacher carefully.

33. To open – Abrir

To make something not closed.

Ex: Please **open** the window.

34. To call – Ligar, chamar

To use the phone / to say someone's name loudly.

Ex: I call my mom every day.

35. To love - Amar

To have strong positive feelings for someone or something.

Ex: She **loves** her dog.

36. To start – Começar, iniciar

t To begin doing something.

Ex: Let's start the class.

37. To stop – Parar

To not continue doing something.

Ex: Please **stop** talking.

38. To ask – Perguntar, pedir

To say something to get information or help.

Ex: I **ask** questions in class.

39. To tell - Contar, dizer

To say something to someone.

Ex: He **tells** a story.

40. To speak – Falar

To use words with your voice.

Ex: She speaks English very well.

41. To hear – Ouvir (sem intenção)

To receive sound with your ears.

Ex: I can **hear** music from the kitchen.

42. To think - Pensar

To use your mind to have ideas or opinions.

Ex: I **think** this movie is great.

43. To meet – Conhecer, encontrar (alguém)

To see someone for the first time or by plan.

Ex: I **meet** my friends at the mall.

44. To show – Mostrar, apresentar

— To let someone see something.

Ex: Please **show** me your homework.

45. To send – Enviar, mandar

To make something go to another person/place.

Ex: I **send** emails every morning.

46. To keep – Manter, guardar

To have and not give away or throw away.

Ex: I keep my keys in my bag.

47. To begin – Começar, iniciar

Continue To start something.

Ex: The movie **begins** at 8 p.m.

48. To believe – Acreditar

To think something is true.

Ex: I **believe** in you.

49. To learn – Aprender

To get knowledge or a new skill.

Ex: I **learn** English every day.

50. To bring - Trazer

To take something with you to another place.

Ex: I **bring** my lunch to work.

51. To pay – Pagar

To give money for something.

Ex: I pay for my coffee at the counter.

52. To fly – Voar

To move through the air (like a bird or plane).

Ex: We fly to New York next week.

53. To sit – Sentar-se

To rest on a chair or seat.

Ex: Please sit down and relax.

54. To stand – Ficar de pé, levantar-se

To be on your feet, not sitting.

Ex: We **stand** when the teacher enters.

55. To grow – Crescer, cultivar

To become bigger or older.

Ex: Children **grow** fast. / I **grow** tomatoes at home.

56. To let – Deixar, permitir

To allow someone to do something.

Ex: My parents **let** me go to the party.

57. To remember – Lembrar

To keep something in your mind.

Ex: I **remember** your name now!

58. To raise – Levantar, criar, aumentar

To lift up or to bring up children.

Ex: **Raise** your hand. / I **raise** my kids with love.

59. To sell – Vender

To give something in exchange for money.

Ex: She sells cakes online.

60. To build - Construir

To make something, like a house or business.

Ex: They **build** houses in the city.

61. To decide – Decidir

To choose what to do.

Ex: I **decide** to stay home today.

62. To follow - Seguir

To go after someone or something.

Ex: Please **follow** me.

63. To pass – Passar, ultrapassar, aprovar

Ex: You can pass the car now. / I passed the test!

64. To wait – Esperar

To make something different.

Ex: I want to change my clothes.

Ex: I'll **consider** your idea.

72. To suggest – Sugerir

To give an idea or opinion for someone to think about.

Ex: I **suggest** we go by train.

73. To expect – Esperar, aguardar (com expectativa)

f To think something will happen.

Ex: I **expect** a call this afternoon.

74. To provide – Fornecer, oferecer

To give something that is needed.

Ex: They **provide** free food at the event.

75. To require – Exigir, precisar

To need or demand something.

Ex: The job **requires** experience.

76. To serve – Servir, atender

To give food or help; to work for someone.

Ex: She serves lunch at noon.

77. To report – Reportar, relatar

To give information about something.

Ex: I **report** the problem to the manager.

78. To allow – Permitir, autorizar

To give permission for something.

Ex: They **allow** phones in class.

To look after or feel concern for someone or something.

Ex: I **care** about my family.

88. To kill - Matar

To make someone or something die.

Ex: The cold can **kill** plants.

89. To enjoy – Aproveitar, gostar

To take pleasure in something.

Ex: I **enjoy** listening to music.

90. To decrease – Diminuir, reduzir

To become smaller or fewer.

Ex: Sales **decreased** last month.

91. To increase – Aumentar

To become larger or more in number.

Ex: The price of gas **increased** last week.

92. To pull – Puxar

To use force to move something toward you.

Ex: He **pulled** the door open.

93. To set - Colocar, ajustar, definir

To place something in a specific position or establish a rule or goal.

Ex: She set the alarm for 6 a.m.

94. To burn – Queimar

To be on fire or damage something with fire or heat.

Ex: Be careful not to **burn** yourself.

95. To stay – Ficar, permanecer

To remain in the same place or state.

Ex: I will **stay** at home today.

96. To fall – Cair

To move down quickly from a higher position.

Ex: The book **fell** off the table.

97. To appear – Aparecer

Ex: The moon **appeared** behind the clouds.

98. To die - Morrer

To stop living.

Ex: The plant **died** because of no water.

99. To grow - Crescer

To become bigger or develop over time.

Ex: Kids grow fast.
